First "Respite For Caregivers" musical program given in Union County

Scotch Plains, NJ: On Thursday October 18, Music for all Seasons gave the first performance in its new Respite for Caregivers program at the home of Ethel and Harold Mayland in Union, New Jersey. As a local resource it provides information and support to Union County cultural organizations.
